

Scientific Content

The course will give an update on risk factors and disease mechanisms in rheumatic diseases as well as on treatment and possibilities to prevent disease. We will also give and update on basic immunology in context of rheumatic diseases and development of new therapies. COURSE DESCRIPTION

Learning objectives

- Up to date knowledge on risk factors and disease mechanisms for RA and its comorbidities and how to treat and prevent disease
- Basic immunology to understand the role of innate and adaptive immunity in RA and autoinflammatory diseases
- Up to date management of osteoarthritis, fibromyalgia and gout
- Up to date knowledge on pathogenesis and management of SLE, systemic sclerosis, myositis, vasculitis, spondyloarthitis and psoriatic arthritis
- Basic training in how to write a scientific paper, how to review an abstract and how to design a clinical trial and an epidemiological study

Course description

A unique 3 and a half-day (Monday lunchtime thru Thursday lunchtime) refresher, "crash course", in clinical and experimental rheumatology taught by selected faculty of European experts in a very interactive and cordial environment. Participants have the opportunity to meet the experts in an informal setting and network with trainees and rheumatologists from all over the world.

Interactive Workshop Sessions

Participants may choose between the following workshops (1 choice is possible):

- How to design a clinical trial in rheumatic diseases
- How to study adverse events of new therapies
- How to design a study to understand risk factors
- How to design a study to define critical molecular pathways in a rheumatic disease
